SDACOU is accepting online entries through the AKC Online System. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries will be designated as follows: Online entries: 20% (70), paper entries 80% (280), 350 runs per day. If either form of entry has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either the online or paper limits accordingly. Paper entries received within the first 24 hours must include postage or be metered. Entries must be delivered by multi-state or multi-national postal or carrier service, including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS, and DHL.

Entries not on official AKC agility entry forms or photocopies of entry forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC agility entry form are invalid. In addition, entries will not be accepted without fees or signature. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Changes, additions, or corrections to entry forms must be received in writing prior to close of entries. Move-up must be made on or before Monday, August 2, 2021 6:00 PM MT.

Illegible or incomplete entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Entries not accompanied by the correct fees, or a returned check, or a postdated check do not constitute a valid entry. The Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitors may result in their future entries being put on a CASH ONLY basis.

Owners are responsible for any errors on entry forms regardless of who makes such errors. No entry fee will be returned in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after published closing date. Duplicate entries will not be refunded if already processed. **A maximum of 10 entries** per envelope is allowed. Envelopes with more than 10 entries and/or entries received prior to the opening date will be returned.

SDACOU is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing July 21, 2021, 6:00 pm MT. A maximum of 25 entries will be placed on the club's wait list. All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to closing July 21, 2021 6:00 pm MT. Any entries withdrawn that are received by July 21, 2021, 6:00 pm MT will be replaced by a first received wait listed entry if any are available. If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait listed entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial by July 21, 2021, 6:00 pm MT will receive a full refund.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by veterinarian or judge, barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee, or because the dog is ineligible to compete due to being entered incorrectly. Female dogs that come into season after entries close and up to 30 min before the start of the trial, will receive a full refund of their entry fee minus a \$5.00 processing fee per day.

No entry fees will be refunded if the Trial cannot open or be completed by reasons of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, or any other causes beyond the control of the club, trial committee or trial secretary.

Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah may decline any entries for cause and may refuse to receive, or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness, or other cause, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against SDACOU, the trial secretary, or any officials thereof.

If you would like to know the status in writing of your entry prior to the issuance of the running order upon closing, please enclose a self-stamped envelope or postcard along with your entry. **Confirmations and running orders will be emailed unless otherwise requested.**

This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC entry form for this event.

JUDGING INFORMATION AND CLASSES OFFERED

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. For example, the same dog may now be entered in Regular FAST and/or T2B to finish up those titles while also entered in Preferred Master STD/JWW to start working towards their PACH at the lower height. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed.

Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

When calculating entry fees, treat multiple entry forms for the same dog as if only one form had been filled out. In other words, the 1st run entry fee is only paid once per day, per dog, even if that dog's runs have been submitted on multiple entry forms.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO) As of January 1, 2020, For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only allowed in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - o Toys must be non-audible
 - o Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - o Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring

- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
 - A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.
- (Note: This section only needs to be published in the Premium List if the Club is offering FEO.)

Fix and Go On (FNG)

As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

Crate/tent set up will be allowed after the ring has been set up, after 4 pm, Thursday, August 5, 2021.

Judging will start:

8:30 AM on Friday, Saturday, & Sunday (check-in 7:30 AM)

There will be NO paper copies of maps.

Maps and updated run order will be emailed the prior evening.

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging. Dogs that need to be measured must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. They will adhere as closely as possible to the judging schedule. The owner or handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. Neither the club nor the Trial Secretary have any obligation or responsibility to provide a service through a public address system, or stewards, or runners, for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Running Order Conflicts: The trial secretary will make every effort to minimize running order conflicts for a handler running two or more dogs in the same class and height, or in adjacent heights. On the day of a trial, if a handler feels more separation is needed, the club will make every effort to accommodate the request. When more separation is requested, per AKC rule, the judge must be asked to grant the change. The trial chair or gate steward may make the request on the handler's behalf. There are likely very few instances where the request will not be granted. Please note that, also per AKC rule, the second dog may be moved down in the order, but the first dog may not be moved up. Out of consideration for affected competitors, the scribe and the scorer, the club asks that all running order change requests be made no later than before the start of the briefing for the class in question. **Run order is tentative and may be changed at the discretion of the secretary and trial chair.**

***FEO (for exhibition only) and FNG (fix and go) options will be offered. All FAST classes will walk and run together.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

Measuring and Height Card Information

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. If a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present; ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog before its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

NEW Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs to Be Measured List.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not

be eligible and neither are aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

After the close of entries, a dog, which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler, may be moved to the Novice "B" class. A request must be submitted to the trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of EACH trial and must state the reason and justification for the move. A dog may be moved down in their class level (i.e., Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial. (Chapter 1 Section 21)

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Ribbons will be awarded in each jump height division in each class as follows:

A New Title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. A MACH rosette and MACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH. A PACH rosette and PACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their PACH. Please let the trial secretary know if you are close to attaining your MACH or PACH when you send in your entry so we can celebrate with you. Double Q pins will be available for dogs Q'ing in both M/E JWW and M/E STD on any given day.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

'Anytime you are on Scotsman Equestrian Center property, masks must be worn. This is both a county and a Scotsman Center Mandate. Please also maintain social distancing of 6'.

There will be no Food services, and no nearby places to eat. Club will provide bottled water and packaged snacks for volunteers. Please bring your own lunch and water.

Maintain 6 FT distance when you are crating. Maintain Social Distancing, no group gathering.

If you are sick, please stay home. Contact tracing forms will need to be completed each day.

One person in the ring, one on deck, and the next person, only 3 people are allowed in the waiting area at a time.

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such

case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah and its agents, employees, trial secretary, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah, Trial Secretary, or any official thereof.

Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah will not be responsible for the loss of/or damage to any dog entered and exhibited, whether the result of accident or other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this trial is under the care, custody, and control of its owner or handler at all times. Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah, Club officers, board members, and the Trial Secretary assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by the exhibitors, their dogs, or property.

All dogs must be on leash at all times or otherwise confined when on trial/show grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course. (AKC leash restrictions March 2009, Utah leash law/code 6.16.080)). Trial grounds are defined as while inside the building or within the surrounding property.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Crating space is available on the floor. Crating cannot be set up until the ring is completed. Ring setup will start at 5 PM on Thursday, August 5, 2021. Crates may be set up after ring is set. Crates may be left overnight but the Salty Dogz Agility Club of Utah and Scotsman Equestrian Center will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

There will be no food vendor at this trial. No lunch will be provided. The club will have some bottled water and packaged snacks. Please plan on taking care of yourself.

Vendors must contact trial chair, Cynthia Heyman by August 1, 2021. Anyone selling taxable items is required to obtain an event vendor license from the State of Utah. Requests for an event vendor license must be requested by the club.

DIRECTIONS TO THE TRIAL SITE (need new directions)

From the North: Take I-15/I-84 south. When I-15 and I-84 fork at the Riverdale/Cheyenne exit, take I-84 east towards Morgan. Take Exit 92 - Mountain Green/Huntsville and turn left at the stop sign. Pass under the bridge. Turn right at UT-167-N. Follow UT-167 north for 0.09 miles and take the slight angle to the left onto Cottonwood Canyon RD. Continue on Cottonwood Canyon RD to 5859 Cottonwood Canyon Rd and take a left to the Scotsman Center.

From the South: Take I-15 northbound. At Farmington, use the right 2 lanes to take Exit 324/US-89 towards I-84. Continue on US-89 for 5.2 miles. Use the right lane to merge onto I-84 E towards Morgan. Follow I-84 E to UT-167 N. Take Exit 92. Turn left at the stop sign. Pass under the freeway and turn right onto UT-167-N towards Mountain Green/Huntsville. Continue on UT-167-N for 0.09 miles and take the slight left angle to Cottonwood Canyon RD. Turn left at 5859 Cottonwood Canyon Rd.

Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial *or back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine PartnersSM** program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.
